

English-Spanish phrases for the angler who fish in Latin America

While many fishing guides at Latin American lodges speak English, some do not. Here are some general phrases that will be very helpful for basic communication. In the first column, of course, is the English. This is followed by the Spanish phrase which appears in *italics* type face. Next or below it is the phonetic pronunciation of the Spanish. The accent is shown in **bold**. The syllables of each word are connected by dashes. It's quite easy to use. Remember, you can't expect the guides in foreign countries to speak English anymore than we should expect guides in the United States to speak a fluent language.

Guides and other camp personnel will greatly appreciate your attempt to learn their language.

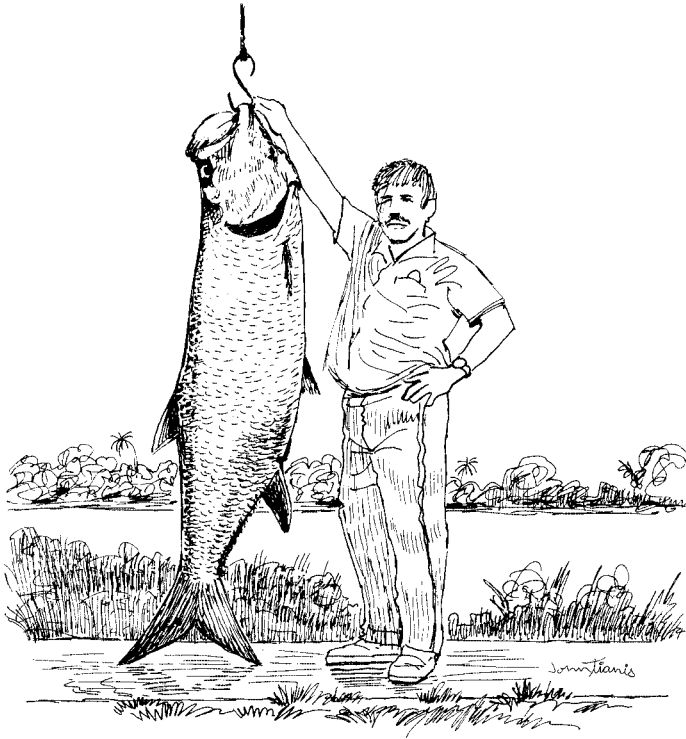

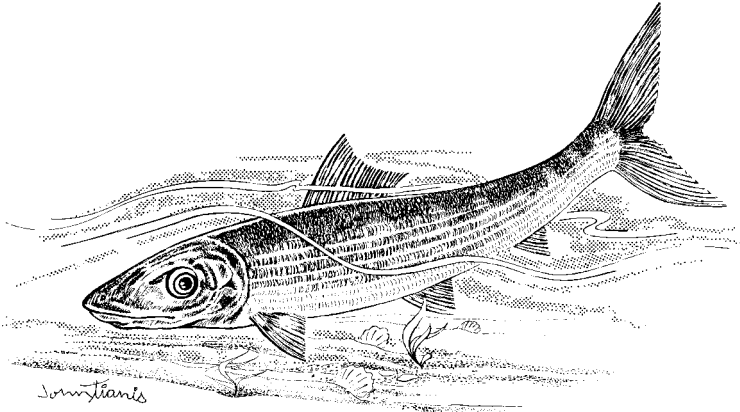
